In 1992, while members of the Men's Glee Club at Michigan State University, Paul, Chuck, Mark and Glen humbly formed a singing group expecting to sing only one song in a glee club concert. Now, all these years later, these guys continue to find success with everything that they do. They have shared the stage with American legends like Chuck Berry, Dionne Warwick, Bob Newhart, Peter Cetera, Pat Boone, Lee Greenwood, and The Beach Boys.

Three Men and a Tenor have performed their programs for festivals, public concerts, schools and corporate functions - in 2003 they even had their very own PBS-TV music special. Their range of tunes varies from sentimental numbers to rock 'n' roll classics from the 50's to the 90's.
